

Royal visit secured by G4S

Perimeter security leaves no stone unturned for visit by the British and Qatari royal families

The opening of the South Hook Liquefied Natural Gas (SHLNG) terminal in Pembrokeshire was another opportunity for G4S to demonstrate its professionalism and expertise.

The inaugural opening on 12 May was attended by the Queen, along with the Duke of Edinburgh and the Duke of York and representatives of the Qatari royal family, who own the facility. These visitors required watertight security measures prior to the event.
